ASSIGNMENTS and GRADING BREAKDOWN:

30% collaborative writing and editing: We will form groups of three people each. Each Thursday by 8 pm one person will email the 2 others a 250-500 words paper on some aspect of the reading for the *following* week's session. The other two will comment on the paper using Word and send their comments to the author by Saturday 8 pm. The author will then make revisions and send the final version of the paper to me by email (CC to the others) by Monday 8 am (preserving the edits and comments of the others). I will return comments by Monday 8 pm. The lead author will then present the paper during the Tuesday class session. Each group will produce a paper 2 out of every 3 weeks. We will thus have two papers presented to the Tuesday session each week. Each group will write 6 papers total, so each student will be lead author 2 times during the semester.

70% term paper: We will agree on a topic and thesis of your paper in independent discussion. You will need to hand in a topic statement and bibliography prior to a rough draft. You will need to do a draft before the final paper is accepted.
